We were visited by Kenneth more Theatre who performed the story of The Christmas Carol. Children loved the singing and dancing and thought the acting was fabulous!



History: Trip to St. Mary's Church in Wanstead Year 6 visited St. Mary's Church in Wanstead for a guided tour by local Historian Chris O'Donnell. As part of our Autumn 1 History topic about the transatlantic slave trade, Chris showed us the inside of St. Mary's and its surrounding grounds, highlighting its links with the slave trade and how the church is now educating locals about its past.

DT Fairground Rides and Art Sculptures: Throughout the Autumn term, the children have been designing and making both fairground rides in DT and sculptures in Art. The DT fairground rides had to include a pulley system which is commonly used in 'drop tower' attractions, whilst their sculptures were based on someone special to them and was created using a wire armature before covering in Modroc.

Guided Reading: Crater Lake In Autumn 2, the children started reading 'Crater Lake' by Jennifer Killick. This horror story is set in Crater Lake, Suffolk and is about a group of ordinary school children who visit on an overnight residential trip. However, not everything is as it seems... The children have thoroughly enjoyed the story, with many of the children already reading ahead and finding the sequel.
