

PHONICS

- Children are taught to read by breaking down words into separate sounds or 'phonemes'. They are then taught how to blend these sounds together to read the whole word.
- In school the children have a 30 minute daily phonics lesson every day.
- Our chosen systematic, synthetic phonics programme is Twinkl Phonics.


The Phonics Screening
Check is a statutory
assessment that will take
place for all Year 1 children
in the week beginning
Monday 10th June.




- This is a government set test for all Year 1 children in the country.
- Every Year 1 child in the country will be taking the Phonics Screening Check during this week.
- The aim of the check is to ensure that as many children as possible meet the required standard in their ability to decode words.
- The pass mark has historically been 32 out 40.

What will your child be expected to do?

- The check is very similar to tasks the children already complete during phonics lessons.
- Children will be asked to 'sound out' a word and blend the sounds together.eg d-o-g – dog
- As well as blending together real words, there are also alien words for the children to read. This is to check to see which sounds the children know.






























































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


















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PHONICS

- To ensure the children pass the phonics test we need to ensure that the children are secure with all sounds up to phase five.

Glossary:


- Phoneme: A single letter sound (e.g. t or b).
- Grapheme: What the of the sound looks like written down.
- Diagraph: Two letters that make one sound when read (e.g. ch).
- Trigraph: Three letters that make one sound (e.g. igh)
- CVC: Stands for Consonant, Vowel, Consonant.
- **Segmenting:** Breaking up a word into its sounds (e.g. cat would be c-a-t).
- Blending: Putting the sounds together to read a word
- Tricky words: Words that cannot easily be decoded based on the sounds the children already know (e.g. would is a tricky word because if it was spelt phonetically it would be "wood". Children have to learn these words by sight.











How can I help my child to prepare for the Phonics Screening Check?

- 1. Practice the Level 2, 3 and 5 sounds using the sound mats.
- 2. Practice segmenting and then blending words using the "Diagraph or Trigraph? Sound it out! Read the word..." method.
- 3. Practice segmenting and then blending alien words using the "Diagraph or Trigraph? Sound it out! Read the word..." method.
