<u>Children with Special Educational needs - SEND</u> **Updates:** Changes to our SEND team;

As always the class teacher is responsible for ensuring the inclusion and progress of all children including those with special educational needs and in the first incidence should be your first port of contact. However due to the successful appointment of our new SENDCO last year, Chris Chopra Evans will be taking over as the SENDCo for children with SEND in Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 he can be contacted

Parental Concerns: From time to time you may have a concern that you wish to discuss. Initially, I would encourage you to arrange a meeting with the class teacher to share the concern, so that it can be resolved. However, if the issue continues, please arrange to see a member of the senior staff team. Assistant Headteachers: Kimberly, Catriona, Catherine or Kelly or the phase leaders Rehana-Years 1-2 and Josie for EYFS.

Clubs: Please refer to the School website to view the clubs running this term from Monday 18th September. All clubs will need to be booked directly through the club provider. Please do not send any money into the school, except when indicated on the club letter, as per the instructions all monies should be given directly to the club provider as requested. All clubs are subject to availability and are on a first come basis.

Medication for Year 6 Residential trip 2023:

If your son/daughter is on the residential trip to Maes Y Lade in September 2023, please can I ask that medication is in school by Tuesday 19th September 2023- no later. Please note that parents are required to complete a medical consent form for each medication that is provided for their child.

Children with asthma pumps already in school, do not need to provide anything else. However if your child takes their brown pump, this must be in school by Tuesday 19th September 2023. Consent form to be completed

Important: All medication must go to Meena, our Welfare Officer. Consent forms will need completing for any medication that is taken, this includes brown Asthma pumps, Hay fever tablets such as piriton or cetirizine and any other medication that is regularly taken by your child at home. Please also note certain medication can only be accepted if it has been prescribed by the GP so it is important that you speak to Meena as soon as possible, who will be happy to assist you. Thank you!

Universal Free School Meals:

All primary school children in state-funded schools in London will receive Universal free school meals for the 2023/24 school year.

In addition to the above, we encourage parents who are in receipt of any of the following benefits to apply for FSM. These include:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit

Universal Credit - if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household earnings must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)

With this entitlement you <u>may</u> be eligible to other support packages ie. Food vouchers each term, household support fund, funding breakfast clubs, the Holiday Activity Food (HAF) programmes (HAF is funded by the Government and run by councils who help deliver the holiday clubs). This will also provide extra funding to the school to support vulnerable pupils and improve education outcomes.

If you were not entitled to have a Free School Meal entitlement previously and your financial circumstances have changed, please ask at the office for a form to complete.

The office will assist you in your applying for the FSM entitlement should you be eligible and need any assistance with it.
